Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Tri-Parishes,

As I write this letter to you in regard to the annual financial report of the parishes, the recent town hall meetings are fresh on my mind. I want to thank all of you who attended the meetings, as well as those who contacted me directly, for offering your input, sharing your ideas and helping me to know you better. I found the meetings very helpful and informative. Additionally, if not more importantly, I found them encouraging, for your lively faith, commitment to the parishes and desire to build our community was clearly evident. It is heartening to know I am in a community, which truly wishes to live the mission the Lord Jesus gave us, and to do so in the myriad of ways we can, from caring for the most vulnerable and needy in our midst, handing on our faith to our children, spending time with each other socially and worshipping our God through prayer and sacrament. Shortly, I will share with you feedback and input from the meetings.

Growing up, my siblings and I had a newspaper route for many years. A job which has gone by the wayside for the most part. The paper route was important to us, for it provided additional income, above the salary my Father made through his two jobs. It was a rather large route, with well over 130 daily and Sunday subscriptions, which meant going to over 130 homes in our neighborhood every day. We needed the hard earned money to help pay for food and utility bills, the expense of sports, dance classes, etc. and other odd's and end's that came up. If my memory is correct, we made a significant amount of money each week, maybe \$125.00 (including tips), which was not bad cash for the late 60's, the 70's and early 80's. Every Friday afternoon, we had to make an additional round to the homes we served to collect payments for that week. Then we went straight home to give my Mother every penny. At Christmas, when our customers generally offered a nice bonus, she would give us a few dollars to buy presents or to treat ourselves to a movie, and she would use the rest to pay the bills and buy presents for us.

One lesson I learned from the paper route is the meaning of contributing to the overall good and welfare of my family, and helping to provide for our needs. Being members of the family we call our parish community has a similar responsibility. We are called to contribute our time and talents, in order to live our mission, whether it is by being a lector, serving at the food pantry, visiting the sick or homebound or other valuable ways which helps us to love God and neighbor. Contributing to our common good and welfare also means providing the financial support required to pay the bills, make repairs, achieve capital projects, serve our children and young people, offer programs for adults and gather socially. I thank you for the financial contributions you make on a consistent basis to the offertory, special collections which help the wider Church and larger donations to the Grand Annual; all of which are often sacrificial offerings which squeeze your wallets. As well, I thank all of you who generously contribute to parish life by serving in ministries and helping with other activities.

Over the last several years, Fr. Jack was very honest with you about the financial situation of the three parishes; particularly about the weekly offertory contributions and their ability to make ends meet. You have probably read updates in recent bulletins about the weekly collections and noticed the parishes regularly do not meet the amount budgeted for this fiscal year. I echo Fr. Jack's plea from previous years for all of us to find some way of rectifying this situation, in order for us to meet our basic

expenses, without having to use savings, and for us to grow as a community of faith, by achieving many of the goals you offered at the town hall meetings; for example, establishing solid youth ministry programs in each parish. Thank God, there is no debt in either parish, there are some savings and we have been able to address several capital repairs and improvements. However, in my opinion, we will be living on borrowed time, if we do not improve overall income. To this end, I pledge to do my part to encourage and engage more families and individuals to be active members of the parishes. In other words, it is not all on you. I have to do my job.

With the assistance of our very fine business manager, Mr. Rich Gribaudo, and the tri-parish finance council, I will be offering some ideas after the New Year to help us address the financial constraints we know and, above all, to help us collectively contribute to the common good and welfare we share. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact either Rich or myself. We are committed to being good stewards of the resources you provide and to serving you as you need and deserve. May the peace, hope and joy the Child Jesus brought the world the night He was born strengthen us to go forward confident in the Holy Spirit leading and guiding us every step of the way.
